Final Score Calculation Formula:

Example:

Score Conversion & Example:

- 1) For example, the score obtained by Student/Group A = $\frac{370 (Obtained Socre)}{4 (Max. Score)} = 92,50$
- 2) The score of 92.50 (Scale 0 100) is converted into a scale of 0 4 using the following formula:
